Spiritual Standard: Students who hold this leadership role will need to ensure that their spiritual life is a priority. They should behave in a manner that shows younger students that fun and spiritual growth are necessary for a successful ministry.

PAYMENT AND FUNDRAISERS

The Student Ministry will only allow cash and checks as forms of payment. In addition, all sign-ups for events will have an initial, non-refundable deposit to save the seat. Cut-off dates will serve as the last possible dates to cancel without penalty. The penalty for late cancellation will mean that the person who signed up will still be responsible for paying the full balance.

Fundraisers are tools to help students pay for events and for ministry upgrades only. Fundraisers will never be used to enhance any person's finances. Funds raised at fundraisers will be divided amongst the participants toward the cost of the event, trip, or retreat. If a student misses a fundraiser, they are not entitled to benefit from the work put forth. Fundraisers will only happen prior to ministry events and will not be hosted out-of-season


